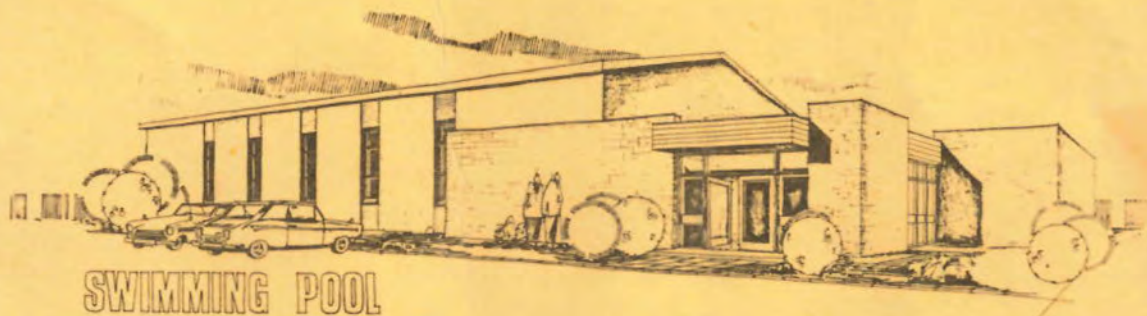

To whom be praise for evermore.

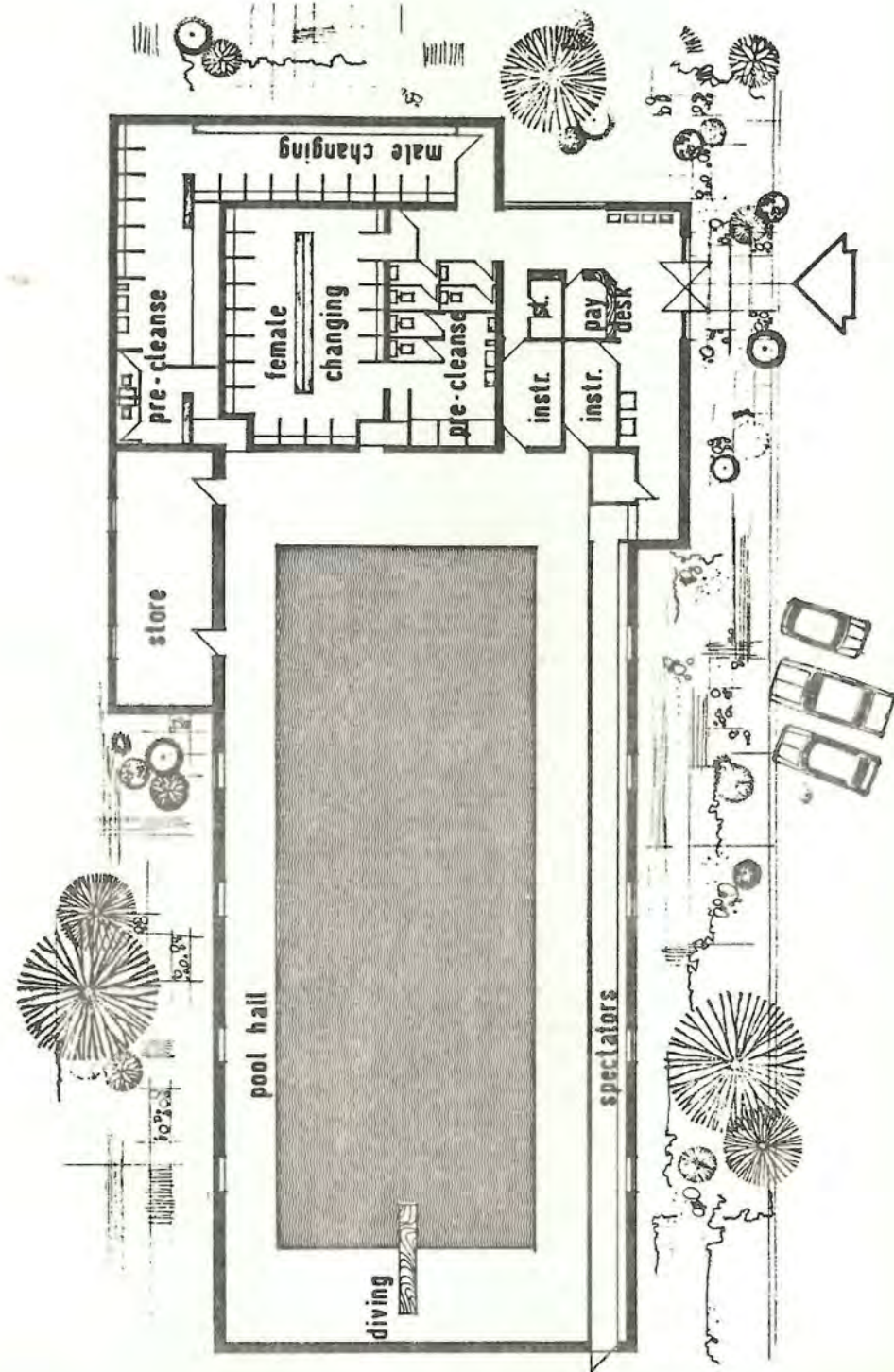

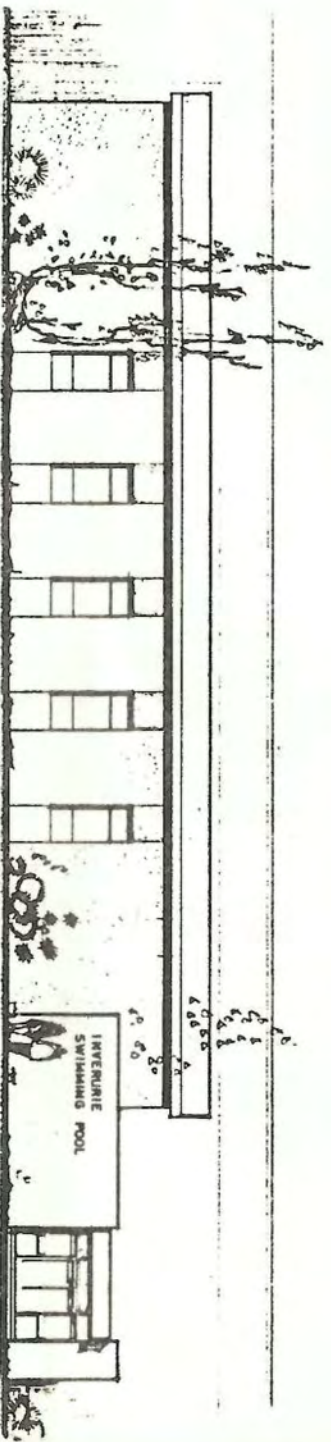
ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES

The Swimming Pool has been sited to the rear of the Academy and adjacent to an existing car park thereby giving reasonable access for both pupils and general public. The entrance is immediately off the car park and on entering the building the pay desk is prominent and serves to split the circulation routes of spectators from bathers. Spectators are led past vending machines to a raised area along one side of the pool hall giving seating for approximately 75 people who are kept off the pool side by a raised wall which serves to separate "dry" spectators from "wet" bathers. Once past the pay desk, the bathers are led to the changing rooms, each of which has 17 cubicles and 96 lockers. Immediately off the changing rooms, the bathers pass through the pre-cleanse areas comprising lavatory compartments, wash-hand basins and shower areas, and thence to the pool hall by way of large footbaths.

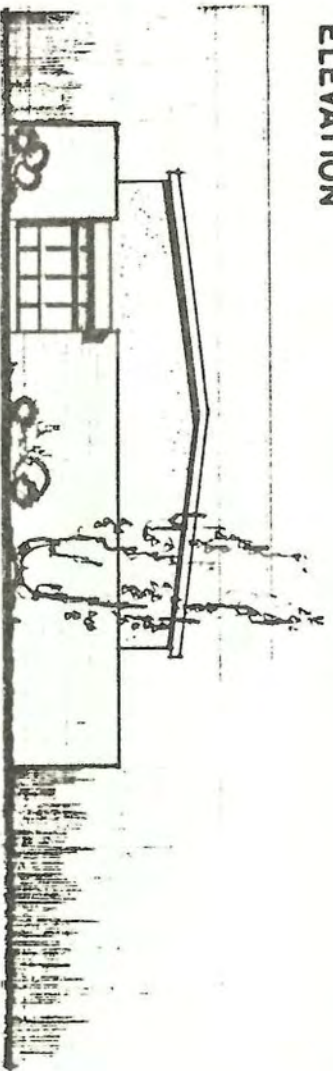
The pool hall houses a 25 metre pool, 30'0" wide, which runs from 3'0" at the shallow end to 10'0" at the deep end, this depth being necessary for a one metre springboard. The pool has four lanes, and has handrails, steps, cup anchors for lane ropes, depth markings, and vacuum sweeper points. Other accommodation includes two instructors' rooms adjacent to the pool hall, with access directly to both the pool hall and the entrance area. Public toilets for both sexes are accessible from the entrance area. A large double store/office is provided off the shallow end walkway.

An unusual feature of the plant for the pool is that the filtration equipment, of the diatomaceous earth type, is housed in the ducts of the Academy and the heating plant is attached to the Academy heating plant. This arrangement ensures that, in the event of any breakdown in the pool heating, the school heating plant takes over.
